



WINE LIST: Autumn 2025

Welcome to Paladar! Our wine list has more than 60 wines sourced exclusively from the length and breadth of Latin America.

Most of the wines are from Argentina, Chile and Uruguay, but we have also uncovered gems from countries not best known for wine production, like Mexico and Peru... and earlier this year we added two excellent wines from Ecuador - a real surprise!

We also showcase some great wines from Brazil and less well-known regions of Argentina - Salta, Patagonia, La Rioja and San Juan - along with less familiar Chilean valleys, such as Itata and Elqui.

The list encompasses a wide range of different wine styles and grape varieties - some of which you may not have heard of, including César Noir, Grüner Veltliner, Petit/Gros Manseng, Marselan and Arinarnoa.

We particularly encourage you to try the region's "Criolla" varieties. These are the offspring of the original grape varieties that the Spanish Conquistadors took across the Atlantic in the 16th Century. Born in South America with fascinating grape names like Quebranta, Torrontés Criolla Grande and Moscatel Rosado, the wines are best served slightly chilled. We have highlighted these, and their "parent" varieties.

Bargain hunters need look no further than the first page (the "Bin Ends") where we are discounting those wines being de-listed.

Our "By the Glass" selection includes a number of more offbeat options - including some Criollas and a lovely Uruguayan Marselan. As far as possible, we are keeping wines by the glass at less than £10 each (and hope you can enjoy more than one!)

This year we have been working towards a "Lower and Lighter" theme: Lower in price and in alcohol and Lighter in style and in bottle weight. For some time now, we have been selecting wines that are not in unnecessarily heavy bottles - being firm believers in the motto "it's what's in the bottle that counts"! All wines of 12%ABV and less as "Lower Alcohol" and we have recently added wines as low as 8.5-9.5%

Be bold and adventurous... We encourage you to discover the diversity of Latin American wines!

The Criollas - Latin America's "indigenous" grape varieties

It was the Spanish Conquistadors that first brought vines and winemaking to Latin America. In the 16th Century they took three grape varieties - **Listán Prieto**, **Muscat of Alexandria** and **Negramoll** - across the Atlantic via the Canary Islands.

These relatively hardy vines were planted widely in what are now Mexico, Peru, Bolivia, Chile and Argentina during the 16th and 17th centuries and were used to make wine for the communion and for general drinking.

Over time these varieties crossed naturally to create new grape varieties that are not found anywhere else in the world. Criolla is a term relating to anything of Spanish descent that was born or created in Latin America - including people, food, music, dance... and grape varieties.

Torrontés, **Quebranta**, **Pedro Giménez**, **Criolla Grande**, **Moscatel Rosado** and **Cereza** may not be the best-known wine-making grapes. However, along with the original three "parent varieties" there are now some super wines being made to high standards by both young and more established winemakers - often with minimal intervention - creating lovely wines that are uniquely Latin American.

Criolla Suggestions from our list

New on the list this autumn is a fresh and easy drinking ultra-low-alcohol Lorca Lo% **Criolla Blanca** from old vineyards in Rivaralda, Eastern Mendoza. Also available by the glass, this replaces Lorca's 2023 Recoleta **Pedro Giménez** (which is being bin-ended), while we continue to list his excellent light red **Criolla Grande**. And if you would like to try an orange wine, Matias Morcos's delicious **Moscatel Rosado** is now available by the glass.

Peru is not best known as a wine making country: Most of the wine is distilled to make Pisco, but many producers now focusing on wine as well as Pisco. We list Copero de Casalla's blend of **Muscat of Alexandria** and **Torontel** from the Cassalla Valley in Peru - grown just outside the town of Pisco.

For a great example of a lovely high altitude **Torrontés** - perhaps the best-known of the Criolla varieties - look no further than our Kaiken from Salta in Northern Argentina. This is fresh and floral without being overly flowery.

In the remote Calingasta Valley, in Argentina's San Juan province, there has been a remarkable project unfolding, with the rehabilitation of ancient vineyards. Cara Sur is a natural wine project headed up by Sebastian Zuccardi (of the Zuccardi wine family). The **Pergolas Criollas Blancas** and Finca Maggio **Moscatel Tinto** are not cheap, we admit, but so worth it...

Looking at the “parent” varieties, Maturana Wines in Chile has rediscovered some old plantings of **Negramoll** (also known as **San Francisco**) in the Loncomilla Valley in southern Chile. ‘Negra’ is a refreshing red and is your chance to try a well-made example of this rare grape variety!

We also list two examples of the “parent” variety, **Listán Prieto**. In Chile, this variety is known as **País** - and we now list Pero Parra's Vinista 100% **País** from Itata. Our personal favourite, though, is Agustín Lanús's, Sunal Ilógico **Criolla Chica** (the Argentine name for **Listán Prieto**). Using grapes from small, remote vineyards at up to 2,700m altitude and fermented with natural yeasts this fine wine is perfect for a special occasion.

We have noted all Criolla wines as such on the list. We generally recommend that the red Criolla wines are served slightly chilled.

Lower and Lighter

We have continued to work towards a "Lower and Lighter" theme this year and are now listing more wines that are 1) Lower in price and in alcohol and 2) Lighter in style and in bottle weight.

Traditionally, many wines from South America would be high in alcohol - often 14% or more - while the more expensive reds were often put into unnecessarily large and heavy bottles to make them appear more impressive. We have even found wines where the bottle itself weighed more than the contents! This is extremely bad practice from a sustainability perspective, using much more glass than necessary. On top of this, having to ship extremely heavy cases of wine on lorries and ships adds to an even larger carbon footprint.

For many years, we have generally chosen not to list wines in overly heavy bottles. We believe it is what is inside the bottle that counts, and this has been borne out in our blind tastings - the price, label and bottle size/weight do not necessarily correlate with the quality of the contents. Whenever we talk to winemakers we raise this subject, and gradually mindsets are changing.

This year we added our first more "sustainable" high quality wine - a Malbec produced in the Uco Valley, bulk-shipped to the UK and bottled in London in lightweight bottles. Bulk shipping has traditionally been for low cost and low-quality wines but we expect to see more quality wines being bulk shipped.

Our cuisine does not really call for a long list of heavy red wines, and we have always shied away from this, choosing, instead, to have a wide variety of different styles and colours. In response to requests for more lower alcohol wines, we now list more than a dozen wines with 12% alcohol or less - and several at 10% or less. Most of the lower alcohol wines are whites, but we also have a 12% orange wine, a 10% rosé and (remarkably) a 9.5% red.

Wines with Altitude!

The Andes Mountains form a dramatic backdrop to many vineyards in both Chile and Argentina. Some of the best-known vineyards and wineries are found in valleys in the foothills of this astonishing mountain range which runs thousands of kilometres from the southern tip of Chile and Argentina right up the western side of the continent.

The higher altitudes (and cooler temperatures) allow cultivation of grapes outside the regular wine-growing latitudes. This gives wines an intensity and character not found from low-altitude vineyards partially due to the variation in nocturnal/diurnal temperatures and the strength of the sun at higher altitudes causing the grapes to form thicker skins.

Many vineyards in the foothills of the Andes are found between 1,000-1,500 metres above sea level, but in Salta (northern Argentina) and Bolivia vineyards are found at altitudes well over 2,000 metres above sea level.

This photo shows the **Masi Tupungato** winery in the Uco Valley, Mendoza. We list their fresh and light “**Passo Blanco**” Pinot Grigio/Torrontes blend - or for something more serious, their “**Corbec**” Corvina/Malbec blend is a divine red. Masi is a well-known Italian wine producer, and these wines showcase an effective blend of some of the best-known Italian and Argentine grape varieties.

Pushing the Limits...

As the climate continues to warm and the weather becomes increasingly unpredictable, so winemakers are pushing into new and ever more extreme terroirs.

Otronia (pictured) is the world's most southerly commercial vineyard, on the 45th Parallel, in a remote location near Sarmiento in Argentine Patagonia. Winters are cold with very strong winds and the growing season is short but intense with long sunny days. Winemaker Juan Pablo Murgia is producing some incredible wines that exemplify the pure and clean, yet harsh environment. We list their delicious **Rugientes 45 Corte de Blancas** (also by the glass) - an unexpected blend of **Gewürztraminer, Chardonnay and Pinot Grigio**.

When winemakers in Mendoza's Uco Valley brag about "high altitude" wines from their vineyards at 1,000-1,500 metres above sea level, those in Salta and Jujuy provinces in northern Argentina must be chuckling. Here you can find vineyards as high as 2,500-3,200 metres (over 10,000 feet) in the Upper Calchaqui Valleys. The intensity of the wines from these altitudes is astonishing. Look out for our lovely Bonarda from **Bodega Colomé** along with any other wines from Salta on our list. And from the other side of the Andes, in Chile's high altitude Elqui Valley, **Viñedos de Alcohuaz** is producing some superb wines - including **Grus** - a blend of Syrah, Petite Sirah and Garnacha.

We have also added two other wines from an unlikely location: the equator. The **Dos Hemisferios** project - almost at sea level near Guayaquil in Ecuador is producing some remarkably good wines. The vineyards are cooled by the tail-end of the Humboldt current, which creates a unique microclimate in the valley. Try the **Enigma Chardonnay** (a blend of the best grapes from the double-vintage) or the excellent **Paradoja Cabernet Sauvignon/Malbec**.

Discover a continent of diverse wines!

Part of our mission at Paladar is to showcase the diversity of Latin American wines - not only in terms of grape varieties and styles but also in terms of the range of different wine producing countries and regions. As we say: It is more than just Malbec from Mendoza and cheap plonk from Chile! Brazil, Peru, Mexico and Ecuador all feature on our list, and we have been expanding our selection from Uruguay - a country that is very much up-and coming in terms of high-quality wine production: Definitely one to watch.

This photo shows the modern winery of **Bodega Garzón** in Maldonado, Eastern Uruguay, which is located 18Km from the Atlantic coast and just 160m above sea level. The mild maritime climate and ancient soils of Uruguay are very different to the dry, sunny, high-altitude terroir of many vineyards in Argentina and Chile. Grape varieties that thrive in this climate include **Tannat**, **Pinot Noir** and **Albariño** - and we list examples of the latter two from Garzón.

We now also list two unusual man-made red grape varieties, both artificially created in France in the 1950s/60s and both growing well in Uruguay. Look out for the **Marselan** from **Bodegones del Sur** and the **Arinarnoa** from **Bresesti**.

Some younger Uruguayan winemakers are being quite experimental: We now list a super sparkling **Albariño** from **Viña Progreso** and a low-alcohol natural wine 'Nakcool' from **Proyecto Nakkal**. Adventurous oenophiles should try the **Bizarra Extravaganza** orange wine. And everyone should try a glass of **Pablo Fallabrino**'s **Alcyone** - a sweet **fortified Tannat** to die for!

Full-bodied Reds - South America at its best!

South America is still best known for its big full-bodied reds and we showcase a diverse selection of interesting reds at moderate prices.

Malbec, of course, remains Argentina's "flagship" red. We love the intense expression from **Domingo Molina** in Salta. We recently added a high quality "sustainable" Malbec, **La Mascara**, from the Uco Valley in Mendoza which is bulk-shipped to London and bottled here. This autumn we also present an excellent Fairtrade, Organic and Vegan Malbec from the Famatina Valley in La Rioja region -also available by the glass. There are just a few bottles of the Bodega Norton L-118 Lunluta Malbec left on the Bin Ends list - grab them before they have gone!

But there are many more excellent red varieties to discover. We have three lovely **Syrahs** on the list: **Intipalka** is from the Ica Valley in Peru while the excellent **Pyros** is from the little-known Pedernal Valley in Argentina's San Juan province. At the top end, **Guaspari** is a relatively new winery in the hills of Sao Paulo province in Brazil. It is too wet during the summer to produce quality wine, but through a double-pruning technique they "trick" the vines into sleeping during the wet summer season and growing during the dry sunny winter months. The results are spectacular!

Chile is also producing some great reds. The **Carménère** from **Viña Arboleda** in the Aconcagua Valley is a tremendous example of this grape variety that last year celebrated its 30th year of "rediscovery" in Chile. Other super reds from Chile include **Viña Maquis**, **Lien** - led by a beautifully aromatic **Cabernet Franc** and **Viña Vik A Cabernet Sauvignon** - both are from Colchagua. Meanwhile, from the south of the country **Morandé** is producing an excellent **Carignan** from old vines in Maule. This is part of the **VIGNO** movement, promoting the revival of old Carignan vines in the province.
